#### The profile of the participants

- 331 U-reporters participated in the survey conducted from 23 January to 10 February 2023 with an online questionnaire through the U-Report Greece platform supported by UNICEF.
- □ The participants belong to the following age groups:
  - 0-14 years: 24%
  - 15-18 years: 58%
  - 19-24 years old: 18%
- The participants live mainly in Attica, followed by Central Macedonia, Thessaly, and Epirus.
- **69%** are girls and 31% are boys.
- **18%** are refugees and migrants
- **3%** have some form of disability

#### **Poll dissemination**

The dissemination of the questionnaire was carried out by the Members of the National Mechanism for Elaboration, Monitoring, and Evaluation of Action Plans for the Rights of the Child, in coordination with the Assistant Advocate for the Rights of the Child and the UNICEF Office in Greece. For this purpose, the questionnaire was forwarded to services, cooperating agencies, working groups, and professionals working with children, as well as through the social networks of UNICEF and U-Report Greece.

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








#### Do you know what the National Action Plan for Children's Rights is?



50% of girls and 40% of boys stated that they do not know what the National Action Plan (NAP) is for the Rights of the Child.

Only 14% of girls and 22% of boys know about NAP.




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#### Which topic do you consider to be important and therefore should be included in the Action Plan?





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








#### Which issue do you consider the most important for combating child poverty?



"[...] the vocational training of parents, second chance schools, actions to develop skills necessary for the modern, globalized society, such as courses in the correct use of computers. Thus, the parents will not be constantly financially and materially dependent on the state, but they will be able to escape from unemployment or claim a position that is more promising and hopeful financially'




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#### Which issue do you consider to be the most important for children's access to cultural activities, leisure, and entertainment opportunities?



Access to artistic activities emerged first in Peloponnese (38%) and Attica (35%).

In Central Greece (50%) and Thessaly (37%), the operation of sufficient playgrounds and sports facilities was the main issue.



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








#### Which issue do you consider the most important for a safe and healthy family environment?



"We all know that there are times when many complaints are not taken seriously, and that the necessary attention is not given. Therefore, every time there is information about incidents of domestic violence, the child must be immediately taken to a safe place, and have access to specialist child psychologists to help him recover. Under no circumstances should we leave children in environments that are dangerous for them." AND "thorough checks by agencies in the event of a complaint of child abuse, without delay and indifference."



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

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








## Which issue do you consider to be the most important for the protection and inclusion of children with disabilities?






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#### Which issue do you consider to be the most important for children's protection and access to the Internet?
